## REPORTING RESOURCES

---

You may report instances of sexual harassment and sexual assault to any staff, administrator, faculty, or student residence hall staff in person, by phone, in writing, by email or by text (when texting, you must include your name.)

When you report an incident of sexual harassment or sexual assault to one of these individuals, they will make the Title IX Coordinator aware of what happened to you. The Title IX Coordinator will reach out to you to offer you measures and services the College has available to support you, as well as the steps the College can take to address the situation and prevent it from happening again.

### A Note on Privacy

Your information and information pertaining to the complaint will be kept private, and made available only to individuals who have a direct need to know in order to address the matter and bring about its resolution.

## IF YOU EXPERIENCE SEXUAL HARASSMENT OR SEXUAL VIOLENCE

---

- 1 Get to a safe place**, any place away from the person(s) harming you.
- 2 Contact LAPD (911) or Campus Safety** (323-259-2511 or dial 5 from any campus phone) if you are in danger or need immediate help or emergency services.
- 3 Access campus and local community services to receive care, support, and assistance.**
- 4 Preserve evidence in instances of sexual violence.** Put each item of clothing you were wearing at the time in a separate paper bag, and do not shower, bathe, douche, wash, or clean any part of your body, including brushing your teeth, until you have had a medical exam. Do not clean the scene or move anything.
- 5 Seek medical care as soon as possible.**  
**Within 96 hours of an assault:** Call Oxy's Survivor Advocate (323-259-1359) or Oxy's 24/7 Confidential Hotline (323-341-4141) to arrange transportation to a local hospital with a Sexual Assault Response Team.  
**After 96 Hours of an Assault:** Consider HIV and STI testing at Emmons Student Wellness Center, which can also distribute prophylaxis.
- 6 Consider filing a report** about what happened. You may file a report with both the Title IX Office and with the police. The Title IX Office and Campus Safety are available to help you file a report with the police.

## OBTAIN A PROTECTION ORDER

---

In circumstances where you are concerned that you may be contacted by the person(s) who have harmed you or may harm you, contact Campus Safety or the Survivor Advocate for assistance with obtaining a restraining order, or the Title IX Coordinator to obtain a College stay-away letter.

## 24-HOUR MEDICAL CARE

---

NOTE: In California, medical providers (but not psychological counselors) are bound by state law to notify law enforcement if a patient tells personnel s/he has experienced sexual assault.

## TELL SOMEONE WHAT HAPPENED

---

### You Set the Pace

When you tell someone what happened, you do not have to decide at that time what you want to do, nor do you have to even know how to label what happened. Deciding how you want to proceed can be a process that unfolds over time, at your pace.

### Confidential Resources

These individuals will keep your information confidential, and will not discuss or release what you tell them to anyone without your consent. They can provide you with resources and information and link you to services.

Please note when you discuss the matter with a confidential resource, the College may be limited in its ability to fully respond without knowing the identities of the individual(s) involved.
