HONORIS CAUSA

PETER ROOS '64

Peter Roos is a retired civil rights attorney and lifelong advocate for educational equity, best known as lead counsel in the landmark 1982 Supreme Court case *Plyler v. Doe*, which guaranteed undocumented children access to public education. “With the sensitivity of an artist, he has worked the complex environment with an understanding of the power and limitations of his tools combined with a fine sense of whom to push, when, and how,” educators Kenji Hakuta and Diana Mercado-Garcia wrote in 2020.

A native of San Francisco, Roos majored in political science at Occidental, where he played football and was a member of Phi Gamma Delta fraternity. He completed a J.D. from University of California, Hastings College of Law in 1967.

Over his decades-long career, Roos served as litigation director for the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund (MALDEF) and co-director of Multicultural Education, Training, and Advocacy (META). He fought to establish legal protections for bilingual education and immigrant students, arguing key cases such as *Goss v. Lopez* (1975), securing students’ right to due process before suspension, and *Keyes v. School District No. 1, Denver* (1983), which enforced quality standards for bilingual programs. His work helped define educational rights under the Equal Protection Clause and Civil Rights Act.

Beyond *Plyler*, Roos’ litigation set critical precedents, including the Castañeda standards for effective bilingual education. In his 2020 book, *Putting My Mind and Heart to Education Equity: Memoirs of an Advocate*, he reflects on his career and the ongoing struggle for justice. His work, marked by a deep understanding of legal nuances and a sensitivity to the needs of underserved communities, has made a lasting impact on the fight for educational equity. He and his wife, Emma, live in Walnut Creek, California.

ROSALIND WISEMAN '91

Rosalind Wiseman is a global thought leader, bestselling author, and sought-after speaker on leadership, conflict, and youth culture. For decades, she has helped people articulate difficult experiences and restore dignity to families, schools, and workplaces. Blending warmth, wit, and irreverence, she tackles serious topics with humility and purpose, engaging audiences at the highest levels of government, education, and business.

A native of Washington, D.C., Wiseman majored in political science at Occidental, where she worked with refugees in Central America during her junior year. In 2002, she published the *New York Times* bestseller *Queen Bees & Wannabes: Helping Your Daughter Survive Cliques, Gossip, Boyfriends, and other Realities of Adolescence* (2002), which served as the inspiration for the *Mean Girls* films and musical. She has since written eight additional books, including *Masterminds & Wingmen: Helping Our Boys Cope With Schoolyard Power, Locker-Room Tests, Girlfriends, and the New Rules of Boy World* (2013), and *Courageous Discomfort: How to Have Brave, Life-Changing Conversations About Race and Racism* (2022).

Currently, Wiseman serves as a senior leadership consultant at the U.S. State Department’s Office for Overseas Schools, which serves more than 195 schools throughout the world, and as a consultant at the Texas Science Behavior and Mind Institute. She has spoken at the White House numerous times across administrations, the Library of Congress, Google, Microsoft, and at conferences including SXSW and the Game Developers Conference (collaborating with fellow Oxy grad Ashly Burch ’12 at the latter).

Wiseman is a board member of the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Center. She is the mother of two young men and lives with her husband, James Edwards ’89, in Boulder, Colorado.
