

RESIDENT ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF COSTUME DESIGN DEPARTMENT OF THEATER & PERFORMANCE STUDIES

POSITION SUMMARY

The <u>Department of Theater & Performance Studies</u> (TPS) at Occidental College invites applications for a Resident Assistant Professor of Costume Design with appointment to begin August 16, 2025. The appointment period is annually from August 16-May 16 (9 month academic year) and the initial contract is for 2 years. Upon review, the contract may be extended in 3-5 year terms, subject to Union contract guidelines. MFA in Costume Design/Technology or commensurate experience required.

The Department of Theater & Performance Studies (TPS) seeks to provide students with a holistic experience in performance practice, history, and analysis, and we use our productions as laboratories to test and deepen the work in our classrooms and studios. We are searching for a highly collaborative specialist in theatrical Costume Design, and this faculty member will:

- Design for three mainstage productions, and/or supervise designs by students or guest designers.
- Teach between 2-3 classes in an annual year. These courses include <u>costume design</u>, <u>costume construction</u>, <u>stage makeup</u>, <u>period styles</u>, and other design courses as needed.
- Train and assist students completing costume production <u>lab hours</u> and student/casual labor staff who build the costumes for three TPS productions and support assorted student and class generated projects;
- Maintain equipment and stock in the costume shop and the storage areas of the TPS Department;
- Manage the costume shop by working with costume designers (student, faculty, and guest artist) to build, rent, and purchase materials and costumes for our productions, working within the budgets established for each production.
- Possibly teach in the First Year Seminar program, if they would like to.
- Mentor student costume designers and serve on senior comprehensive project committees
- Attend department faculty meetings and participate in the department's events and planning

This faculty member will participate in the life of the department working with the faculty and staff to maintain the excellence, rigor, and ingenuity of the program. Occidental faculty are committed teacher-scholars who bring research and creative discovery to life for students in classrooms, labs, studios, and mentored projects. They teach broadly in the curriculum of their department, advise and mentor students, establish themselves as exceptional researchers and practitioners in their fields, and provide departmental, college-wide, and external service. As a small institution, faculty across disciplines build community with one another and occasionally collaborate in team-teaching and research projects. Located within the vibrant city of Los Angeles, Occidental is committed to a community-engaged curriculum—faculty build fieldwork, visits to local museums and cultural organizations, and long-standing partnerships into their courses. Occidental is also committed to undergraduate research, regularly mentoring students in Occidental's hallmark summer research program. We seek an innovative teacher, scholar, mentor, and colleague who wishes to work in such

an environment and who shares these commitments to a community-grounded and research-intensive curriculum.

- Ability and interest in mentoring student designers
- Ability to balance excellent teaching with designing
- Demonstrated commitment to the <u>mission of the College</u>.

statement (1 paragraph) that addresses your approach to the studio and advancing equitable opportunities, an artist statement (1-2 paragraphs) addressing your goals and approach to your design work, and a statement on collaboration (1 paragraph).

- Link to an online portfolio that includes professional costume design work for scripted theater and, if applicable, costume design in an academic setting
- A list of 3 references and contact information

Applicants who advance to future phases of the search will be asked to submit the following materials. Please be prepared to submit these materials should you move forward, but do NOT submit them with your initial application.

- Applicants who advance to the semi-finalist phase will be asked to submit a sample syllabus for Costume Design
- 3 Confidential letters of recommendation
- Applicants who advance to the finalist phase will be asked to give a teaching demonstration during their on-campus visit.
