## **GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT WORKSHEET**

Occidental requires all students to complete seven General Education requirements in order to graduate from the College. Transfer students are encouraged to complete as many of these requirements as possible before transferring to the College **although applicants are not required to complete all requirements before applying**. General Education requirements are the easiest course credits to transfer and completing them prior to entering the College allows you to immediately focus on the classes in your major.

The following worksheet is designed to help you estimate the number of Occidental General Education credits you will have completed before entering the College. In completing this worksheet, be sure to include courses in progress as well as completed courses.
